- On December 15, 1972, because of our excellence in Greek education, our school became the first in New Jersey to be officially recognized by the Greek Government.
- Because of our school's initiative, the State of New Jersey now includes the Greek language as part of the Regents High School Test. Our graduates who take this exam consistently rank among the nation's top scorers.
- In December 2014, our school proudly opened a Children's Library with more than 2,000 Greek books—a living library that our students love to explore.
- Today, our school continues this long tradition of excellence, carrying forward the vision of our founders while adapting to the needs of new generations.

Our Mission

Classes & Programs

Registration Information

For a student to be enrolled and continue in the Greek School, his /her family must

- Be a member in good standing with the St. Demetrios Church.
- Have fulfilled all financial obligations to the church and the Greek School.
- In the PreK (K1) class, the child must be four (4) years old by Sept. 15 for the school year beginning in September.
- Discounts are offered to families enrolling two or more children.
- Early registration discounts are offered from May to June 30 of the preceding year for the school year starting in September.
