Dear Parents and Parishioners,

The past year was a busy time for our Catechesis School! After the COVID disruptions, we were grateful to resume our normal schedule and activities.

In November, we did our annual **Thanksgiving project**. The children wrote thankfulness messages on paper leaves, which we hung on branches to decorate the entrance of our church. We also hosted a **Youth Singers Workshop** offered by the Eastern Federation of Greek Orthodox Church Musicians.

In December and in March, we organized our **Prison card project**. The children made greeting cards to send to Christian prisoners through the **Orthodox Christian Prison Ministry**.

In January, we celebrated St. Basil and the New Year by cutting the **traditional Vasilopita**.

When Great Lent started, all our classes worked on **Lenten activities** to learn about this most important period of the church calendar. We all faithfully participated in the icon procession on **Sunday of Orthodoxy**. The older classes also took part in an **international Pascha Exchange:** The children prepared greeting cards, videos, and little gifts which they exchanged with children from other Orthodox communities around the world, learning about their Pascha customs and traditions. We exchanged greetings with communities in the United States, Uganda, Serbia, and Australia.

The weekend before **Holy Week**, we learned about Holy Week and Pascha, and helped our community prepare the palm crosses. Fr. Emmanuel gave a moving lesson to the children on Holy Wednesday, after the Holy Unction. On Holy Friday, our Myrofores did a wonderful job honoring the Epitaphios; we are really proud of them!

After Pascha, we collaborated with GOYA to organize a **fellowship meal for the seniors** of Union. Our students did a great job making placemats, preparing, serving, and entertaining our guests!

On **Mother's Day**, the children prepared a special gift to honor and thank their mothers for all their love and care.

We concluded the year with an edifying pilgrimage **trip to the St. Nicholas Shrine** in NYC.

We are very proud of our older students who diligently served our Lord and His Church throughout the year as Altar Servers and readers!

We **extend heartfelt thanks** to the parents and grandparents who have been making an effort to bring the children to class on Sundays! Having a full classroom makes our catechists' voluntary work so much more meaningful.

May our Lord bless and guide us all, until we meet again in the fall!

GRADES 2-4

We always try to do hands-on activites in our class. Throughout the year, we did a kindness project, where children were assigned small acts of kindness to complete at home. We also used prayer stations, to get more specific in our prayers. We started the year learning about the Proskomide, the prosphoron, and the parts of the Divine Liturgy. Then we explored fundamentals of the Orthodox Christian life: Kindness, prayer, humility, repentance, the Mysteries of Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Communion and Confession. We worked on themes of the Nativity season, then on Lenten themes. We explored Holy Week and Pascha, and finished the year working on the Feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, then discussing the Saints. Finally, we exchanged Pascha greetings with a homeschooling group in Maryland, and with a class in Australia. I am extremely proud of all the students who did a wonderful job! Have blessed summer!
